His works have been exhibited in shows across the country, and depict the landscapes and lifestyles of the Pacific Northwest.

His work illuminates the boats, people, and maritime activity that has defined a way of life for the Western Washington coast.

The paintings take the viewer from the mouth of the Columbia to the Puget Sound in a historical and imaginative exploration of the region's waterways.
