A Watercolor History by Robert Chamberlain

Come for a watercolor exhibition by award-winning painter Robert Chamberlain. His work illuminates the boats, people, and maritime activity that has defined a way of life for the Western Washington coast. The paintings take the viewer from the mouth of the Columbia to the Puget Sound in a historical and imaginative exploration of the region's waterways.

Featured artist Robert Chamberlain, 87, has lived in the Puget Sound nearly all his life and has been painting professionally in Olympia since 1960. His works have been exhibited in shows across the country, and depict the landscapes and lifestyles of the Pacific Northwest.

Some of his other work include "Sylvester's Window," on display at the Olympia Timberland Library, and "Timber!," a 75-piece collection previously exhibited at the Washington State Historical Museum in Tacoma.
