Jennifer Shaw Wolf feels she has lived her teen years at least three times: first as a teen; second, as a mother raising teens; and third, writing for teens.

On her website, Wolf notes "I've always wanted to be a writer."

"I wrote my first book for my little brother, sewed the pages together and had one of my friends illustrate it. Once in sixth grade, I started an underground newspaper. In high school, I was part of an all-girls yearbook staff. Because I had three brothers in sports, I was nominated to write all of the sports copy. I wrote about everything from football to wrestling to rodeo."

Wolf grew up in the tiny farming community of Wilford, Idaho, graduated from Brigham Young University, and now lives in Lacey.
