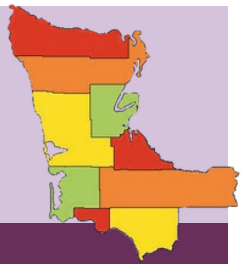

STRYKER GOOCH

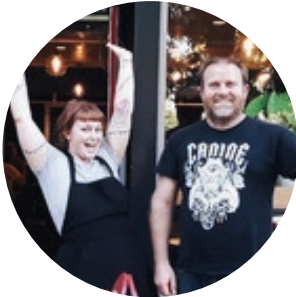

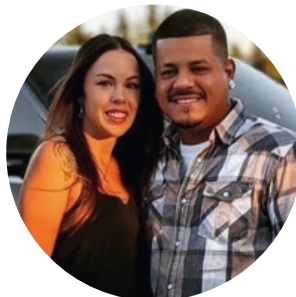
Thurston
