Families also had the chance to work together on three Fairy Tale Problem-Solving Kits, which encouraged them to think like engineers by solving challenges inspired by classic fairy tales. In addition, participants explored Rigamajig Spinning Tops, which provided a hands-on experience with motion and design, and a kit about the human body that introduced fundamental biological concepts in an interactive format.

STEM Night was a fantastic opportunity for families to explore new learning experiences together, fostering a love of discovery and innovation. The collaboration between SICDC and Timberland Regional Library helped bring these valuable resources to the community, promoting early STEM education in a way that was both educational and enjoyable.



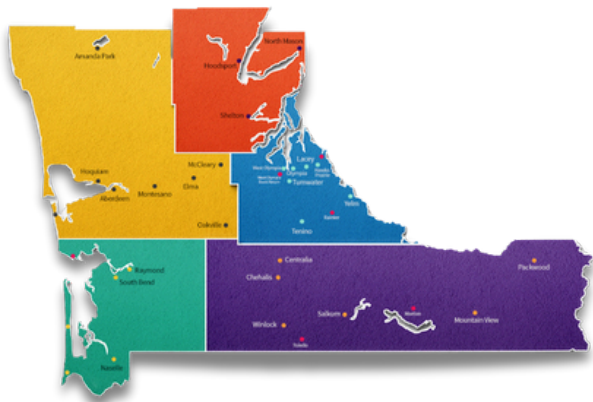
